

## Personal Gear

- Clothing for the season, weather, and length of deployment (Keep in mind that we can experience all four seasons in one day.)
- Boots to protect your feet from glass, pieces of metal, etc. (Tennis Shoes are OK for a backup only)
- Extra socks and underwear
- Work gloves
- Toilet kit: soap, razor, deodorant, comb, toilet paper
- Foul weather or protective gear, warm coats, hats, etc. as needed
- Sleeping bag, closed-cell foam pad or cot, pillow, and ear plugs (The only area to sleep might not be very quiet)
- First aid kit, personal medications and prescriptions for up to one week
- Telephone calling card or lots of change
- Mobile phone with extra batteries or auto charger
- Flashlight, spare bulb and spare batteries
- EDS Uniform items
- Salvation Army ID Card and a Driver's License or State ID
- Maps, Statewide shows all the back roads (Colorado Atlas and Gazetteer, 5<sup>th</sup> Edition) and for Denver Rand McNally's StreetFinder® is a good one.
- Key phone numbers
- Letter or legal size writing pad or steno notebook
- Several pens or pencils
- Basic tool kit or pocket multi-tool
- Reading Material
- Sun screen
- Camping Chair
- Small Tent
- Any items, snacks, tea bags, etc. that make you feel more "at home" than what we carry on the canteens.
